Bible Verses:

- 1st Corinthians 15:33; 2nd Samuel 13:1-33

Family Discussion:

Family Challenge:

Write a short paragraph describing what it means to be a good friend to someone. Share your descriptions with your family.

Family Bible Goals: Take time to work on your Family Bible Goals! (p. 17)

Dating and Sex

Purpose: *To discover God’s answer for the following questions: 1) What is acceptable contact in a dating relationship and 2) How can I have a pure dating experience.*

Bible Verses: Ephesians 5:3 (NIV); 1st Corinthians 6:12-20

Family Discussion:

Ephesians 5:3 (NIV)—“*But among you there must not be even a hint of sexual immorality.*”

What is sexual immorality? According to this verse how much sexual immorality will God tolerate? How should this verse impact what we do physically on a date?

*1, 2, 5, 6 and 7 are obviously unacceptable. 3 and 4 can be acceptable, but they can also be unacceptable if they lead to other things or are causing one to lust. **Parents we must remember that our kids are getting a message that all of these things are ok except for maybe #7!***

Read 1st Corinthians 6:12-20: Why does God take sexual sin so seriously? What are some physical, emotional and spiritual consequences of engaging in sexual immorality?

Family Challenge: Young people write down five things that you can do to have a Godly dating experience. Parents write down five things that you can do to help your children have a Godly dating experience. Share your lists with each other.

Family Bible Goals: Take time to work on your Family Bible Goals! (p. 17)

Marriage

Purpose: *To read and discover God's eternal plan for the marriage relationship.*

Bible Verses: Genesis 2:18-24; Ephesians 5:22-31; 2nd Corinthians 6:14-18; Matthew 19:6

Family Discussion:

Read Genesis 2:18-24: Why did God make a woman for man? How did God describe the relationship between husband and wife in Genesis 2:24?

Read Ephesians 5:22-31: What responsibilities does a woman have to her husband in the marriage relationship? Describe what it means to submit to someone.

What responsibilities does a man have to his wife in the marriage relationship? What illustration is used to show how deep a man should love his wife?

How is the woman's responsibility of submission connected to the man's responsibility of sacrificial love? What happens if one of these responsibilities is ignored by the husband or wife?

List the three most important qualities you should look for in a marriage partner.

Family Bible Goals: Take time to work on your Family Bible Goals! (p. 17)

Divorce

Purpose: *To read and discover what God says about divorce.*

Bible Verses:

- Matthew 5:31-32; Matthew 19:1-9; 1st Corinthians 7

Family Discussion:

What does Jesus say about divorce in Matthew 5? How did what He say differ from what the Jews were practicing under the Old Testament?

What is the only reason given by Jesus in Matthew 5 for ending a marriage relationship? What sin is committed if someone goes against this teaching? What is adultery?

Read Matthew 19:1-9: What question was Jesus asked in Matthew 19:3? How would the world answer this question? How did Christ answer this question?

How does God feel about divorce? How did Jesus illustrate God's feelings concerning divorce? (vs. 6)

What is the only reason Jesus gives for ending a marriage relationship in Matthew 19? (vs. 9)

How does a divorce affect a family? What are some decisions you can make to prevent yourself from being in this situation?

What is the most important decision you can make to build a marriage that does not end in divorce? (*Marrying a New Testament Christian is a great way to start a marriage that will last. It is unfortunately not a guarantee that a marriage will work, but it increases the odds tremendously!*)

Family Challenge: List some harmful effects that divorce has on a family. Share your list with the family.

Family Bible Goals: Take time to work on your Family Bible Goals! (p. 17)

Modesty

Purpose: *To read and discover what God says concerning our dress.*

Bible Verses:

- 1st Peter 3:3-4; 2nd Samuel 11:1-5; Matthew 18:1-6; Jeremiah 8:12

Family Discussion:

What is modesty? Which items below are immodest in God's eyes?

Mini skirts *modest* *or* *immodest*

Short shorts *modest* *or* *immodest*

Tight clothing *modest* *or* *immodest*

Low cut dresses *modest* *or* *immodest*

Does society seem to give modesty much thought? Explain. Where is immodesty being portrayed the most? What would be a good slogan to describe society's view of modesty?

What does Peter say about modesty in 1st Peter 3:3-4? What is more important our outward appearance or inward appearance? How must we dress in order to keep our hearts pure?

Read 2nd Samuel 11:1-5. How does immodesty relate to lust? What affect did Bathsheeba's appearance have on David? Who sinned—David or Bathsheeba? (Both of them were wrong!)

When you dress immodestly, what thoughts do you think are going through other peoples minds? Is it possible to cause other people to sin by what we wear?

Read Matthew 18:1-6—What does Jesus say will happen to anyone who causes someone else to sin? How should this impact our dress?

Read Jeremiah 8:12—What problem is Jeremiah addressing in this verse? Does sinfulness including immodest dress cause you to blush?

Weekly Challenge: Go through your closet and get rid of all immodest, ungodly clothing! Pray for the strength to dress Godly!

Family Bible Goals: Take time to work on your Family Bible Goals! (p. 17)

Overcoming Lust

Purpose: *To read and discover what God says about lust and how to overcome it.*

Bible Verses: Matthew 5:27-30; James 1:13-15; 1st Peter 2:11;
1st Corinthians 6:18; Philippians 4:8-9

Family Discussion:

Is it sinful to view pornographic materials? What does Jesus say about lust in Matthew 5? When someone looks at pornography, are they lusting after that woman? According to Matthew 5, does a married man commit adultery against his wife when viewing pornography?

Read James 1:13-15: What does lust (evil desires) lead to? What does sin result in? Viewing pornography (lusting) is a sin that can cost us our soul.

Read 1st Peter 2:11: What do fleshly lusts do to the soul? What kind of war is being described here? Why did Peter use the word war to describe the internal struggle against lust? How can we win the war against lust and pornography?

What are the main sources of pornography today? (*movies, magazines, internet*) If someone is struggling with this sin, what are some things they should do? What does Jesus say about overcoming lust in Matthew 5:29-30? How does this apply to the internet or to magazines?

What does Paul say in 1st Corinthians 6:18 about overcoming the temptation of sexual immorality? What does the word flee mean?

Read Philippians 4:8-9: List two things from these verses that we can do to overcome the temptation of viewing pornography.

We can overcome the sin of lust associated with viewing pornography by: *1) removing the source of the temptation, 2) running from the temptation when faced with it, 3) filling our minds with Godly things, 4) following the example of Godly people such as Paul.*

Family Challenge: Read and discuss 1st Corinthians 10:13 as a family in relation to lust and viewing pornography.

Drugs and Alcohol

Purpose: *To discover what God says about using drugs and alcohol.*

Bible Verses: Proverbs 23:20-21 & 29-35; 1st Corinthians 6:12-20;
Galatians 5:16-24

Family Discussion:

Why are so many young people giving into the temptation of drinking and using other drugs? What impact does choosing to use drugs and alcohol have on ourselves and others?

Read the verses in Proverbs: What insight does Solomon give us about the effects of drinking? Do you know of anyone who fits this description?

What do we learn about our bodies in 1st Corinthians 6:12-20? Our bodies are the _____ of God. How does God expect us to treat our bodies? In what harmful ways do drugs and alcohol affect our bodies?

Galatians 5:16-24: List some deeds of the flesh (sinful nature) from verses 19-21.

Family Bible Goals: Take time to work on your Family Bible Goals. (p. 17)

Music in Today's Society

Purpose: *To compare the music we listen to verses the music God would want us to hear.*

Bible Verses: Romans 12:1-2; 1st Corinthians 13:4-7; Colossians 3:5-17

Family Discussion:

What are your three favorite CDs? What impact do these CDs, and other music you listen to have on you? How does music affect our attitudes? Music has a tremendous influence inwardly. Does music also affect us outwardly (dress, language)? Explain.

Read Romans 12:1-2—What does it mean to be transformed by the renewing of your mind? In what ways can music “conform us to this world?” Does listening to music dealing with sex, violence, murder, etc., help us become righteous in God’s eyes?

Read the words of Jesus in Matthew 12:34 and Matthew 15:18—*Some parents and teens protest and argue that the singers don’t really mean what they are singing. They claim it’s just a song.* Compare this statement with the words of Jesus in the above verses. Do the parents and teens have a good argument? Explain.

1st Corinthians 13:4-7 are powerful verses on God’s view of love. In the music industry today, how many of these teachings on love are broken?

Read Colossians 3:5-17—What are some things from verse 5 and 8 that we are to avoid as Christians? How many of these topics are talked about in a positive manner in many songs today? How does verse 17 apply to our discussion on the music we listen to? Can you honestly say that all the music you listen to is Godly?

Family Challenge: Make a list of all the CDs you own as a family (this may take a while). Label each CD as Godly or ungodly based on the Bible verses you have discussed in today’s lesson. Take all the CDs that are ungodly and throw them away.

Family Bible Goals: Take time to work on your Family Bible Goals! (p. 17)

What Are We Watching?

Purpose: *To identify God's standard for the television shows and movies we watch.*

Bible Verses: Colossians 3:1-4; Matthew 15:17-19; Matthew 6:22-23

Family Discussion:

List some of your favorite TV shows. What are your three favorite movies of all time? What impact does television and movies have on people today?

List three good things about TV and movies. List three negative things about television and movies. What are some things that we see and hear on television and at the movies that goes against God's will?

How do you decide what TV shows and movies to watch? Read Colossians 3:1-4: If Paul had a TV or was able to go watch a movie during his missionary journeys, how would he decide what to watch and what not to watch?

Does your family watch R-rated movies? Why are movies given an R-rating? (*Movies are rated R because of cussing, violence, nudity and sexuality*). Parents—Would you allow people to come into your home and cuss, beat each other up, and have sex while your family sat and watched? Isn't that what were doing when we rent movies and watch TV shows filled with all of these things?

What does Jesus say about the eye in Matthew 6:22-23? Read Matthew 15:17-19: What are some effects of watching movies and TV shows filled with sinfulness?

If Jesus stayed a week with you in your house, would you watch the same movies and television shows you normally watch?

Family Challenges:

1. Refuse to watch any R-rated movies.
2. Only watch the TV shows that Jesus would watch.
3. Spend more time reading the Bible and praying than watching TV.

Family Bible Goals: Take time to work on your Family Bible Goals! (p. 17)

Homosexuality

Purpose: To read and discover what God says about homosexuality.

Bible Verses: Genesis 19:1-13; 1st Corinthians 6:9-11; Romans 1:26-27; Matthew 19:4-6

Family Discussion:

The first example of homosexuality in the Bible is found in the city of Sodom in Genesis 19. What happened to the city of Sodom as a result of their wickedness?

Read 1st Corinthians 6:9-11—What does Paul say about the unrighteous in verse 9? What does the word unrighteous mean? In which verse does Paul mention homosexuality as an unrighteous practice?

Paul urges the Corinthians to not be _____. Has our society been deceived about the sin of homosexuality? Explain. Have you and your family been deceived? Does your family watch TV shows that openly promote homosexuality? (Friends, Will and Grace, etc.)

1st Corinthians 6:11 tells us that those caught up in the sin of homosexuality will not inherit the kingdom of _____.

Read Romans 1:26-27—How does Paul describe God's feelings about homosexuality? How does Paul describe the practice of homosexuality in these verses? Based on the above verses, how does God view homosexuality?

In Matthew 19:4-6, we learn what is right or natural in the eyes of God. From the beginning, God purposed for a man and a woman to marry and become one flesh. Is it OK in the eyes of God for two men or two women to marry each other?

Family Challenge: As a family, take an active stance against homosexuality. Refuse to watch any television shows that promote the practice. Write your lawmakers, who are being pressured to make laws accepting homosexual marriages and practices, a letter sharing your families belief in God's teaching on this subject.

Abortion

Purpose: *To read and discover whether abortion is right or wrong in the eyes of God.*

Bible Verses: Jeremiah 1:4-5; Judges 13:7; Judges 16:17; Job 31:15; Romans 13:9; Matthew 1:18-25

Family Discussion:

What is abortion? (Parents take a few minutes to explain to your teen what abortion is.)

Jeremiah 1:4-5—When did God tell Jeremiah He knew him?

Judges 13:7 and 16:17—Samson was called a Nazarite unto God from the _____.

Job 31:15—When was Job formed by God?

Reflecting on the above verses, when does life begin in the eyes of God?

Read Exodus 20:13 and Romans 13:9—What do we learn about murder from these two verses? What is murder? Is abortion murder in the eyes of God? Why?

Read Proverbs 6:16-19—There are six things mentioned in these verses that the Lord hates. Which one of these applies to abortion? Is aborting a baby the shedding of innocent blood?

In Matthew 1:18-25 we read about the conception and birth of Jesus. What was Joseph's reaction when he discovered Mary was pregnant? How would you have felt if you were Joseph? How do you think it looked for Mary to be pregnant and not yet married?

What trials did Mary and Joseph face? What would have happened if they had decided to have an abortion? How does this example apply to us today?

Family Challenge: Parents—Take a few minutes to answer any questions your teenagers have on abortion. ***4,320 babies are murdered through the practice of abortion everyday!*** Make a list of three things you can do as a Christian family to fight against this widely accepted practice.

Enduring Consequences

Purpose: To help our children to understand the lasting consequences sin can bring about.

Bible Verses: 2nd Samuel 12:1-18; 1st Corinthians 10:13; Romans 6:23

Family Discussion:

In 2nd Samuel 12 who comes and speaks to David? Describe the story that Nathan spoke to David? How was David described after hearing this story?

Who was Nathan talking about in his story? What sin had David committed?

List the consequences David had to endure throughout the remainder of his life because of his sin.
